Once received, the scammer threatens to leak it publicly unless the victim pays money or sends more content. Scammers often operate across platforms, using fake profiles and emotional manipulation to gain trust.

Friendly Approach

Initiated via social media, dating apps, gaming chats.

Blackmail Begins

Threats to leak content unless demands are met.

Fake Identity

Posing as attractive individuals, influencers, or mutual friends.

Trauma Phase:

Threats continue post-payment, causing severe emotional distress.

Flirtation & Requests

Victim is lured into sharing personal or intimate images/videos.

Escalation & Control

Scammers escalate demands, worsening victim distress.

➔ Consequences



For Victims

- Anxiety, depression, and psychological trauma
- Guilt, shame, and loss of self-esteem
- Financial losses and privacy violations
- Suicidal thoughts in extreme cases
- Fear of judgment leads to withdrawal from relationships.
- Ongoing distress affecting future interactions and trust.



For Society

- Increased cybercrime rates
- Public fear of online interactions
- Strain on mental health and law enforcement resources
- Reduced trust in social media platforms.
- Increased costs for law enforcement, mental health services, and cybersecurity measures.
- Difficulty in tracking offenders due to cross-border cybercrimes.



➔ Targets & Warning Signs

Who Is Being Targeted?

- Teenagers & Students – Targeted via social apps and games.
- Young Professionals – Exploited through LinkedIn, dating apps, WhatsApp.
- Homemakers – Lured with fake social media opportunities.
- Crypto Traders – Tricked via fraudulent trading apps.
- Influencers – Exploited with fake collaborations.
- Senior Citizens – Manipulated through scams and false tech support.



Red Flags

- Sudden messages from unknown people wanting to chat privately
- Push to switch to encrypted apps like WhatsApp or Telegram.
- Urgent or repeated requests for images or video calls
- Threatening language demanding payment in crypto, wallets, or gift cards

➔ Prevention & Response



How to Stay Safe

- Never share personal or intimate content with strangers
- Enable strict privacy settings on all social platforms
- Avoid engaging in flirtatious online chats with unknown persons
- Cover webcams when not in use
- Educate youth about consent and digital safety



If You Are Targeted

- Do NOT pay – it rarely stops the threats
- Stop communication immediately and block the perpetrator
- Take screenshots and preserve evidence
- Report at: <https://www.cybercrime.gov.in>
- Inform the local police or cyber cell
- Seek mental health support and talk to someone you trust

➞ Recent Incidents

A Pune youth repaid loan but faced extortion threats from fake loan agents. They circulated morphed nude images of his female relative, causing severe emotional distress.

A Maharashtra cyber analyst immediately notified the local police, intervening in time to prevent his suicide.

In Pimpri-Chinchwad, a man was blackmailed with morphed nude images and threatened with public circulation for ₹51 lakh. Tragically, he took his own life

A case was filed, and six individuals were arrested, including call-center operators based in Kolkata.

A 64-year-old man was trapped in a video chat scam and coerced into disrobing. Posing as cyber police, scammers demanded ₹4.6 lakh to delete the footage.

Immediate action by Maharashtra cyber cell helped the victim report the crime, enabling swift intervention.
